Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

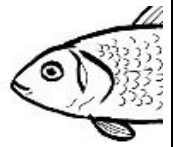
(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which we believe are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees completely when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and other casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass services.

- **CHRISTMAS NOVENA** begins Dec. 16. Copies are available to take home & it is posted on the bulletin tab.
- **EMBER DAYS:** This is the winter Ember Week (Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday). The Ember Days are days of fast for those age 21-59 and days of partial abstinence for those age 7 and older.
- **HOLY HOUR** date has been changed to this **THURSDAY**, December 15, at 6:00 PM.
- **NO CHILDREN'S ACTIVITIES** this Wednesday, since there is no Mass scheduled. They will resume in mid-January.
- **TITHING ENVELOPES** for 2023 are ready to be picked up in the hallway for those who have been using them and those who requested them for the first time. They are labeled alphabetically.
- **SCHOOL BAKE SALE** will be after all three Masses next Sunday, December 18.
- **SCHOOL PROGRAM** will be after the 11:00 Mass on Dec. 18. All are welcome! There will be free hot cocoa and coffee for those attending the program, as well as baked goods to purchase in support of our school.
- **CATECHISM CLASSES** will be held today, Dec. 11. Then there will be no more Sunday classes until January 22.
