Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which we believe are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees completely when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and other casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass services.

We are happy to see new faces at Immaculate Conception Church, and we look forward to seeing you again!

Confessions: 30 minutes before each scheduled Friday, Saturday, & Sunday Mass, and after Wed. & Saturday Mass.

- EPIPHANY POTLUCK will be after all the Masses next Sunday, January 15.
- NEW CONVENT: Thank you for all the enthusiastic support of the efforts to obtain the house next door for a convent! Your generosity and kindness has made this possible. - <u>EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSINGS</u>: Father Molina will be available to travel to homes to give the Epiphany blessing from January 10-13, this Tuesday through Friday. Please contact Father Molina if you are interested.
- <u>SAINT ANNE BOOKLETS</u> are available (only one per family, please.) These were kindly donated by a parishioner for free distribution.
- <u>ICE SKATING PARTY RESCHEDULED</u>: All parishioners are invited to join Father Molina and the ICA school children at Bernick's Arena (1109 1st St. S., Sartell) from 12:30 to 2:30 PM this Wednesday, January 11. The ice rink will be rented for our whole group, so you may come to skate for free if you have your own ice skates. If you do not have ice skates, your only cost would be the skate rental (\$5 per person.) You do not need to sign up ahead of time. You may just arrive around 12:30 and start skating (and pay for any skates needed for your own family.) IF THE SARTELL PUBLIC SCHOOLS are canceled for weather, the skating party will be canceled. Contact Sr. Philomena with any questions.
