Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last good confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water. (Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which we believe are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees completely when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and other casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass services.

We are happy to see new faces at Immaculate Conception Church, and we look forward to seeing you again!

- <u>EASTER DUTY</u>: All the faithful who have reached the use of reason are gravely obliged to receive Holy Communion worthily at least once during the Easter season. In the United States, this extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).
- <u>CONGRATULATIONS</u> to Emily and Alex Miller on the birth of their baby boy, Aiden James, born March 29, and weighing 7 pounds, 10 ounces!
- <u>HOLY WEEK MISSALS</u> are available in the vestibule for you to borrow, if you do not have the 1956 Holy Week ceremonies in your daily missals.
- <u>ALL NIGHT ADORATION</u> for those who can spend some time with Our Lord on Thursday night/ Friday morning: Sign-up sheet is in the vestibule. Even if the hour when you plan to come is already covered, please sign your name as well so that other parishioners making holy hours know who is coming and going during the night.
- HOLY COMMUNION ON GOOD FRIDAY is around 1:45 PM, so it would be safe to start fasting by 10:30 AM.
- <u>FOR THE VENERATION OF THE CRUCIFIX</u> on Good Friday, only the clergy should double-genuflect three times. The faithful should genuflect only once on one knee at the front of the church before kneeling to kiss the crucifix. Please genuflect while the person ahead of you is venerating the crucifix so that the line keeps moving. If anyone cannot kneel, the servers can lift the crucifix up for you.
- <u>THE EASTER VIGIL CEREMONIES</u> will begin at 10:30 outdoors, in front of the church, with the blessing of the Paschal Fire. Please be aware that if you drive up between 10:30 and 10:50, the outdoor part of the ceremony will be occurring around that time. All lights must be extinguished until the Paschal Fire is lit.
- <u>PARKING</u>: If the parking lot fills up, you may park along the roads and cul-de-sacs. Please be respectful of the neighbors and do not make any unnecessary loud noise, especially in the middle of the night.
- <u>HOLY SATURDAY</u> is a day of complete abstinence from meat for all those aged 7 and older, and a full fast day for those aged 21-59.



- **EASTER WATER** which is blessed during the Easter vigil ceremonies before the midnight Mass will be available for parishioners to take home. Please only fill one container per family until the Sunday after Easter, so that more people will have a chance to take some on Easter in case it runs out.
- <u>THANK YOU</u> to all who helped with the spring cleaning and all church cleaning and projects! A Mass will be offered for you today.
- <u>PLEASE PRAY</u> for the repose of the soul of Gerald Rewolinski, Lori Schroepfer's father.
