EASTER DUTY ~

All the faithful who have reached the use of reason are gravely obliged to receive Holy Communion worthily at least once during the Easter season. In the USA, this extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).

Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

Confessions: 30 minutes before each scheduled Friday, Saturday, & Sunday Mass, and after Wed. & Saturday Mass.

- <u>HOMEMADE GRANOLA BARS</u> will be for sale after the Masses today. This is a fund raiser to help pay

- <u>FULL CHURCH</u>: There will be fifteen first Communicants next Sunday, April 30, so all the pews in the church and cry room will be needed for their families and friends at the 9:00 Mass. If you are not relatives or friends of the children making first Communion or the choir, please try to attend the 7:00 or 11:00 Mass on April 30 if possible.
- <u>THE LAST SUNDAY CATECHISM CLASSES</u> will be held today, and on May 7. All those being confirmed and receiving first Holy Communion, please do not miss either of these last classes!
- HOLY HOUR for April, the month of the Blessed Sacrament, will be at 6:00 PM this Wednesday, April 26.
- ROSARY & FAMILY GAME NIGHT: This Friday, April 28, is the feast of St. Louis de Montfort. Those who have made Total Consecration may gain a plenary indulgence by renewing it on this date. At 6:00 PM, there will be renewal of Total Consecration and Rosary, followed by games in the parish hall. Bring your favorite board games to share! You may also bring finger-food snacks to share if you wish.
- <u>SCHOOL REGISTRATION DEADLINE</u>: If any parish children will be in kindergarten next year, or if you plan to send any new students to Immaculate Conception Academy, please speak with Sr. Philomena (320-333-9358) by **May 7**. (To be in kindergarten next school year, children must reach their fifth birthday by Sept. 1, 2023.)
- <u>PLEASE PRAY</u> for the five deacons who will be ordained on May 11. If you would like to give the new priests cards and/or donations, you may give them to Fr. Molina <u>by May 7</u> so he can bring them to Omaha for ordinations. The names of those being ordained are: Frater Aloysius, CMRI, Rev. Caleb Armour, Rev. Adam Craig, Rev. Matias Chimenton, and Rev. Giles Pardue. You may especially wish to remember Rev. Adam Craig from Michigan, who has been assigned to assist Fr. Molina at our parish. (There are also seminarians receiving clerical tonsure and advancing in minor orders on May 9.)
