EASTER DUTY ~ All the faithful who have reached the use of reason are gravely obliged to receive Holy Communion worthily at least once during the Easter season. In the USA, this extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).

Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.
- (Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

We are happy to see new faces at Immaculate Conception Church, and we look forward to seeing you again!

Confessions: 30 minutes before each scheduled Friday, Saturday, & Sunday Mass, and after Wed. & Saturday Mass.

- COFFEE AND BITES will be served after all the Masses next Sunday, May 7. There will be espresso coffee, regular coffee, and a bite to eat, all for a free will donation.
- THE BANNS OF MATRIMONY are announced for the second time for Jason Cook and Maddie Doroff. If anyone is aware of an impediment to this marriage, please notify one of the priests.
- CONGRATULATIONS to the fifteen children making their first Holy Communion at the 9:00 Mass today!
- SCHOOL REGISTRATION DEADLINE: If any parish children will be in kindergarten next year, or if you plan to send any new students to Immaculate Conception Academy, please speak with Sr. Philomena (320-333-9358) by next Sunday, May 7. (To be in kindergarten next school year, children must reach their fifth birthday by Sept. 1, 2023.)
- LAST SUNDAY CATECHISM CLASS for this school year will be held next Sunday, May 7. The class with Sr. Philomena on May 7 will be only for those who are being confirmed this May, and will be in the meeting room.
- SUMMER CATECHISM will be Monday through Friday, June 19 23, from after the 8:00 AM Mass until noon. There will be classes taught by visiting sisters for children age 5 and older, as well as classes by Bishop Pivarunas for high school and adults. All parish children who do not attend our Catholic school should attend if at all possible. It is also highly encouraged for the teens and adults of the parish.
- GIRLS AND BOYS CAMP dates are in the box of upcoming events below. Registration forms are available in the vestibule. Please mail the registration as soon as possible to the addresses on the forms.
- Also, please plan ahead for your children's rides and plan on carpooling with other parishioners, as the school van is not in good enough condition for long trips any more, and rides cannot be provided by the church.
- PLEASE PRAY for the five deacons who will be ordained on May 11 and for those receiving minor orders on May 9 (including Franz and Leopold, who are receiving the orders of exorcist and acolyte). If you would like to send cards and/or donations, you may give them to Fr. Molina by May 7 so he can bring them to Omaha when he goes to ordinations. You may especially wish to remember Rev. Adam Craig from Michigan, who has been assigned to assist Fr. Molina at our parish.
