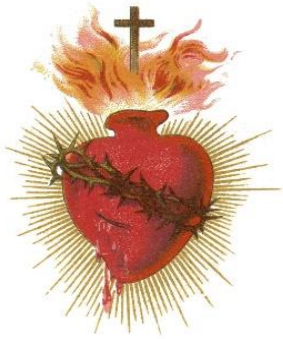

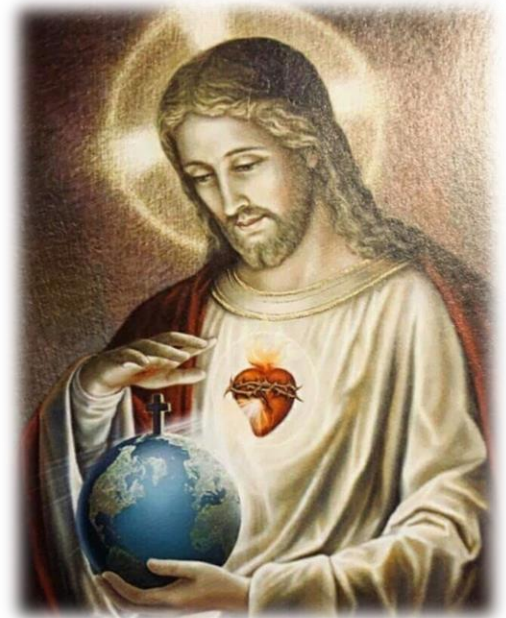

## **Welcome To Newcomers!**

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.  
(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

- **CORPUS CHRISTI** high Mass with incense and procession will be today at the 9:00 Mass.
- **CONGRATULATIONS** to Mr. and Mrs. Brandon and Katelynn Roelike, who were joined in holy matrimony!
- **CONGRATULATIONS** to Kenny and Rose Larkey on the birth of their baby boy, Michael Jerome, born on June 7 and weighing 5 pounds, 7 ounces!
- **CHRISTIAN MODESTY:** Remember Our Lady's warning about immodest fashions. We should always be careful to give a good example by our modesty in dress and demeanor, no matter how hot the weather. Ladies and girls must be especially careful that their tops are not low cut, and should never approach the communion rail unless properly covered. Also, clothing should not be too tight, and skirts must cover the knees when sitting and standing.
- **PASTORAL LETTER ON MODESTY** by Bp. Pivarunas is available for free, and a PDF is also available online on the bulletin tab. It is recommended for all ladies and girls (and also for husbands and fathers) to read or review it.
- **SUMMER CATECHISM** will be Monday through Friday, June 19 - 23, from after the 8:00 AM Mass until noon. There will be classes for children age 5 and older, as well as classes by Bishop Pivarunas for high school and adults.
- **EVENING CLASSES:** In addition to the daily morning classes, the bishop will have a class for adults and teens at 7:00 PM on Tuesday and Thursday, June 20 & 22, for those who cannot come in the mornings.
- **PLEASE SIGN-UP** children in grade school on the sheet in the vestibule by **today**.
- **MASS INTENTIONS** which have been sent to be offered elsewhere have been posted in the vestibule.
- **HANDICAPPED CONFESSIONS:** If anyone is handicapped and would like to arrange a time to go to confession inside the library, please do not hesitate to ask one of the priests.
- **DOORS ARE UNLOCKED** one hour before the earliest Mass, for those who like to come early to pray. During the day when no services or activities are going on, the doors are kept locked. If you would like to come during the day to make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament (no later than 7 PM), please contact Father **ahead of time** to make sure that he will be around to let you in. Someone is usually at church, but it is safer to check before going out of your way.
- **VISITING:** Please feel free to visit with other parishioners after Mass. When there are no catechism classes going on (between the first and second Masses during the school year), you may visit in the parish hall, and of course outside. Please remember that the vestibule is part of the church during services, so do not visit in the vestibule **or** hallway during the next Mass, or when the rosary before the next Mass has begun. Thank you for your consideration of others who are praying in church!
- **CAUTION:** When standing in the vestibule, please make sure no one is standing too close to the St. Philomena shrine candles so that no one catches on fire or knocks candles over. Please supervise your children at all times, both inside and outside the building (especially at the playset.)
- **CRY ROOM:** During Mass, please treat the vestibule as the cry room, and thus as part of the church. Please do not attend Mass in the cry room unless you have young children who need to be there. Parents have asked for it to be announced that enough room is left for those who need to be there. Thank you!
- Out of respect for the other parents attending Mass in the cry room, please bring crying or very noisy children down into the parish hall. The cry room is for the small noises that would be distracting inside the church, but the louder noises need to be brought down to the parish hall to help keep the spirit of prayer in the cry room. Also, loud noises carry right through the glass into the church.
