Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

- **SUNDAY CATECHISM** classes start around 8:15, between the first and second Masses. (Note: Classes will not be held next Sunday, Oct. 8, nor on Oct. 29.)
- **BLESSING OF CHILDREN** for "Angel Sunday" will be after all three Masses today, October 1. Children (and parents holding babies) may come up to kneel at or near the communion rail for the blessing right after all the Masses.
- **PUMPKINS** available for a donation to the school! They will be outside near the tree in the parking lot, while supplies last. Please place pumpkin donations in the envelopes placed near the slot for that purpose. Thank you!
- **TARCISIAN** meeting and enrollment will be this Friday, October 6, after the 8 AM distribution of Holy Communion. After a quick breakfast, activities will begin in the parish hall.
- **OCTOBER ROSARY WITH EXPOSITION:** On Tuesdays through Fridays of October, there will be rosary with simple Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 7:30 AM.
- Please remember to double genuflect (kneel on both knees and bow) if you come into the church when the tabernacle door is open and/or when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed.
- **PRAYER TO ST. JOSEPH** for October and Litany of Loreto are prayed after the rosary. There are paper copies in the vestibule if you would like to take them home. The St. Joseph prayer is posted in the website's bulletin section.
- **CMRI CONFRATERNITY** meeting will be after Mass this Saturday, October 7.
- **CONFRATERNITY OF CHRISTIAN MOTHERS:** All the women of the parish are welcome to join the Confraternity of Christian Mothers for an autumn pie social following the 8 AM Mass this Saturday, October 7, in Becket Hall. Please bring a pie, egg bake, fruit, or any other festive autumn dish to share!
- **ROSARY PROCESSION** will be at 6:00 PM on Oct. 13. (You may pray on your own in church if unable to walk outside.)
- **GAME NIGHT** for families and individuals of all ages will be after the procession on Friday, October 13. Bring your favorite games to share! Feel free to bring finger food snacks to share as well.
- **POTLUCK, SILENT AUCTION, & HEAVEN HOUSE** will be held on October 29. The potluck will be after all three Masses. The heaven house will be after the 7:00 and 9:00 Masses. Bidding for the auction will end at 10:45. So, those attending the 11:00 Mass will need to arrive by 10:00 in order to see the heaven house. You may also arrive early to bid at the silent auction before the 11:00 Mass. If you are not still around when the bidding ends at 10:45, please check the parish hall when you come back for Mass on All Saints' Day so that you can see if you have items to pick up and pay for.
- **ALL SAINTS' DAY PARTY** will be at 1:00 PM on Tuesday, October 31. All children of the parish are invited to join the ICA students in Becket Hall. Everyone will dress up as a saint and give clues for the others to guess their saint, and then there will be a few games. Parents may dress up as saints also. Start planning your costumes now!
- **SILENT AUCTION** on Oct. 29 will be a fund raiser for the CMD sisters in our parish. If you have any items you would like to donate, you may leave them in the meeting room by Oct. 22. (**LARGE ITEMS:** If anyone has something very large they would like to donate, you may send pictures to the sisters to be printed so people can see what they are bidding on. It is best not to bring a very large item to church, unless you are willing to remove it if nobody bids on it.) Thank you and God bless you!
