## **Welcome To Newcomers!**

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.  
(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

**ALL SAINTS' DAY, November 1,**

is a holyday of obligation.

Attendance at Mass and refraining from unnecessary servile work and shopping is obligatory, just as on a Sunday.

**Confessions:** 30 minutes before each scheduled

Friday, Saturday, & Sunday Mass; during or after the 8:00 Wednesday Mass; and after Saturday Mass.

(Also, this week: 30 minutes before the Masses on All Saints' & All Souls' Days)

- **POTLUCK** will be after all three Masses today.
- **SPECIALTY COFFEE** will be available for a donation after all three Masses today.
- **HEAVEN HOUSE** will be open for viewing about 15 minutes after the 7:00 Mass is over. If you are attending the 7:00 Mass, please enjoy the potluck and auction in the parish hall after Mass until the children are ready for the heaven house. When it is open, it will be announced in the parish hall.
- The heaven house will also be open immediately after the Benediction following the 9:00 Mass.
- The entrance is through the library door next to the St. Philomena shrine. Please keep a spirit of silence in the vestibule and heaven house, so that everyone can enjoy the atmosphere.
- Please take a "Did You Know" sheet by the bulletins to learn about some of the saints being portrayed.
- **SILENT AUCTION bidding ends at 10:50 AM.** If you are not still around when the bidding ends at 10:50, please check the parish hall when you come back for Mass on All Saints' Day so that you can see if you have items to pick up and pay for. (Winners will not be individually contacted, so please check!) **There are also some smaller items available to take for a donation right away, without waiting for the auction to end.**
- There will be a bucket for payments. If you pay later, the money may be placed in the slot in the vestibule counter, labeled "for auction." Please make out any checks to the CMD Sisters.
- **THANK YOU** to all who generously donated such a great variety of auction items!
- **SUNDAY CATECHISM** is canceled today. As of next Sunday, the 4<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade group will move up to the parish hall, and the Kindergarteners will move down to the table in the school library (room 108).
- **ALL SAINTS' DAY PARTY** will be from 1:00 to 3:00 PM this Tuesday, October 31. All children of the parish are invited to wear a saint costume and join the ICA students in Becket Hall!
- **TARCISIAN** meeting will be after the 8:00 distribution of Holy Communion on first Friday, Nov. 3.
- **CONFRATERNITY OF CHRISTIAN MOTHERS** will be meeting in Becket Hall after Mass this Saturday, Nov. 4. Please bring breakfast food to share if you'd like to join us. All women of the parish are welcome! We will be discussing Fr. Zepeda's podcast from the Catholic Wire "The Christian Mother Interstate Conference," July 1, 2023.
- **CMRI CONFRATERNITY** will meet on first Saturday, November 4.
- **IMPORTANT BOOK FOR PARENTS** which is highly recommended is available on the vestibule counter, for all parents with children in the parish.
- **NAMES OF DEPARTED SOULS** to be placed on the altar for remembrance during November: You may write names on the clipboards, or bring your own typed or written papers.
- **DOORS WILL BE OPEN** for "toties quoties" visits for the Poor Souls on November 1 from noon to 8 PM, and on November 2 from 6:30 AM to 8 PM.
- **DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME** ends next Sunday, November 5.
- **THANK YOU** for your generous donations to the mission fund. Please remember the foreign missions in your prayers, including Fr. Caleb Armour's new missions in Scotland, England, and Ireland. Please also pray for our several missions covered from Sartell, MN, some of which are covered by one of our priests almost weekly, and some which our priests cover on Mondays as able.

### **Indulgences to be gained during the month of the Poor Souls-**

A **plenary indulgence** for the Poor Souls may be gained from noon on Nov. 1st to midnight, Nov. 2nd, *as often as ("toties quoties")* one visits a church in suffrage for the Poor Souls, if one also goes to Confession and Communion and says at each visit six Our Fathers, six Hail Mary's and six Glory Be's for the intentions of the Church. (*Move your lips when praying to gain indulgences.*)

A **plenary indulgence**, applicable only to the dead, may also be gained by the faithful under the usual conditions during the period of eight days from the commemoration of All Souls' Day inclusive, and on each day of the Octave, when they visit a cemetery in a spirit of piety and devotion, and pray, even mentally, for the dead.
