

Baptism: Please call Father to make arrangements. At least one parent and the sponsors must be practicing traditional Catholics. It is a serious obligation for Catholics to have their newborns baptized within two weeks.

Matrimony: For practicing registered parishioners only. Please contact Father at least six months before the wedding date for marriage instructions.

Mass Intentions may be submitted for a stipend of \$25.00. Mass intention envelopes are available in the vestibule. Vigil Candles: To light vigil candles at the shrines of Our Lady, St. Joseph, or St. Philomena, you may place the money in the slots in any of the vigil candle racks. (\$5.00 for a six day candle and 25 cents for a small candle.)

Sunday Catechism Classes are taught between the 7:00 and 9:00 Masses on most Sundays during the school year.

Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

• MIRACULOUS MEDAL ENROLLMENT for anyone who has not yet been enrolled will be after all the Sunday Masses today. Advent Prayer: Hail and blessed be the hour and the moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Blessed Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour, vouchsafe, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my petitions, through the merits of Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

(Customarily prayed 15 times daily during Advent for a special intention) (Sometimes called the "St. Andrew Prayer" and begun on the feast of St. Andrew) O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee!

(Prayer to the Immaculate Conception on the Miraculous Medal, also called the medal of the Immaculate Conception)
