Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for attendance at church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You must also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for Mass attendance.

We are happy to see new faces at Immaculate Conception Church, and we look forward to seeing you again!

* EASTER DUTY * All the faithful who have reached the use of reason are gravely obliged to receive Holy Communion worthily at least once during the Easter season. In the United States, this extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).





- <u>HOLY WEEK WORK PARTY</u> will be this Saturday, March 23 for those who can stay after the 8:00 Mass to help with cleaning, polishing, trimming palms, etc. You may bring your own Lenten food if you wish, but there will also be bananas, bagels, cinnamon rolls, coffee, and juice provided.
- <u>BAKE SALE</u>: There will be baked goods available on Palm Sunday for a free will donation after both Masses, while supplies last (as a fund raiser for the ICA high school spring outing.)
- <u>SCHOOL REGISTRATION</u>: If there will be any new students in Kindergarten next year, or if any parish families are considering coming to our parish school (ICA) for the first time, please speak with Sr. Philomena before Easter so that plans can be made for the next school year, and papers can be prepared for you. Thank you!
- <u>SUNDAY CATECHISM</u> will **not** be held on March 24 or 31, or April 7. Classes **WILL** be held on April 14, 21, & 28. April 28 will be the last catechism class, except there will be class at 8:15 on May 19 only for those being confirmed.
- <u>THANK YOU</u> to all the volunteers who made the parish breakfast such an enjoyable event, and also to the men who made the new holy water fonts for our church!
- <u>CONFIRMATION</u> will be on May 26 after the 9:00 Mass. Please fill out a form from the vestibule, and return to the slot in the counter ASAP. Thank you!
- <u>SPONSORS</u> must be of the same gender as the person being confirmed, and they must be <u>practicing</u> traditional Catholics who are already confirmed in the traditional rite.
- <u>BAPTISMAL CERTIFICATES</u> must be provided **by April** for those who did not already receive sacraments here.

 12:00 pm 3:00 pm- Stations of the Cross, Solemn Liturgy with Holy Communion, and Meditations on the Seven Last Words. (Note: Holy Communion on Good Friday will be around 1:30 or 1:45.)
