

Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last good confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or yeil, you may borrow a yeil from the yestibule. You must also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

- <u>MISSION SUNDAY</u> is today, October 20. Pope Pius XI designated the second last Sunday of October as Mission Sunday, a day for Catholics to pray for and contribute donations to the foreign missions. The red bordered envelopes in the vestibule are for special donations, if anyone would like to make a contribution to the mission fund. Please clearly mark the envelope "For the Missions." Any checks should be made out to "Immaculate Conception Church." Please also keep the missions in your prayers.
- 2025 CATHOLIC CALENDARS are available for \$10.00, while supplies last.
- <u>2024 SPOKANE FATIMA CONFERENCE</u> talks are available for free viewing on YouTube. Please see the channel for "Mary Immaculate Queen Parish" (miqparish) in Idaho.
- ITEMS TO BE BLESSED, AND THE LOST AND FOUND/ CLAIMS COUNTER is now located in the parish hall. Items to be blessed may be left in the parish hall on the left side of the claims counter (next to the lost and found). Write your name and "Please bless" on the packaging (bag or box...) of the item, and Father will mark it as blessed and leave it on this claims counter to be picked up. Please check by the following Sunday for any items you have left to pick them up.
- <u>ROSARY WITH EXPOSITION</u>: This Tuesday through Friday, there will be rosary with simple Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 7:30 AM.
- HOLY HOUR for October will be on the feast of St. Raphael, this Thursday, October 24.
- ADULT SAINT COSTUME PARTY AND DINNER POTLUCK- This Friday, Oct. 25, at 6 PM. For singles (starting at age 16) and married couples of any age. (No RSVP needed, but check with one of the priests before inviting anyone from outside the parish.) Wear a saint costume and tell a few facts about your saint so that others can guess who you are. Potluck dinner, games, campfire & s'mores, and socializing.
- THE CONFRATERNITY OF CHRISTIAN MOTHERS will be meeting on Saturday, Oct. 26, after the 8 AM Mass. The topic of discussion will be "Enthronement of the home to the Sacred Heart: How to live under Christ's Kingship in our homes." Please bring a dish to share for the breakfast potluck.
- <u>POTLUCK</u> for the feast of Christ the King will be next Sunday, October 27.
- <u>CHILDREN'S ALL SAINTS' DAY PARTY</u> will be from 1 3 PM on Thurs., Oct. 31. All children of the parish are invited to wear a saint costume and be prepared to tell a few facts so others can guess your saint.
- <u>ALL SAINTS' DAY</u>, first Friday, November 1, is a holyday of obligation. Attendance at Mass and refraining from unnecessary servile work and shopping is obligatory, just as on a Sunday. Masses will be at 7 & 9 AM, and 6 PM.
- <u>TARCISIANS</u> usually meet on first Fridays. Since the first Friday of November is All Saints' Day (a holyday of obligation), we will count the All Saints' Day party on Oct. 31 as the Tarcisian meeting for November.
- <u>CMRI CONFRATERNITY</u> meetings will always be after Mass on first Saturdays unless otherwise announced. For November, because first Saturday is All Souls' Day, the Confraternity meeting will be on November 9.
- **PREPARATION FOR TOTAL CONSECRATION**: St. Louis De Montfort's Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary has been highly recommended by many popes. Those wishing to make this consecration for the first time on December 8, feast of the Immaculate Conception, must prepare four weeks in advance according to the form set down by St. Louis de Montfort. Preparation begins on November 5.
- TRUE DEVOTION: Please read the book *True Devotion* before Nov. 5 if you will be preparing to make this consecration on Dec. 8. This book and the preparation prayer booklets are available in the parish library.
