Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last good confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You must also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

We are happy to see new faces at Immaculate Conception Church, and we look forward to seeing you again!

Confessions: 30 minutes before each scheduled Friday, Saturday, & Sunday Mass; before or during the 8:00 Wednesday Mass; and after Saturday Mass.

ALL SAINTS' DAY, first Friday, November 1, is a holyday of obligation. Attendance at Mass and refraining from unnecessary servile work and shopping is obligatory, just as on a Sunday.

- **POTLUCK** for the feast of Christ the King is today, October 27.
- **ITEMS TO BE BLESSED, AND THE LOST AND FOUND/ CLAIMS COUNTER** is now located in the parish hall. Items to be blessed may be left in the parish hall on the left side of the claims counter (next to the lost and found). Write your name and "Please bless" on the packaging (bag or box...) of the item, and Father will mark it as blessed and leave it on this claims counter to be picked up. Please check by the following Sunday for any items you have left to pick them up.
- **ROSARY WITH EXPOSITION FOR OCTOBER:** This Tuesday through Thursday, there will be rosary with simple Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 7:30 AM.
- **CHILDREN'S ALL SAINTS' DAY PARTY** will be from 1 - 3 PM this Thurs., Oct. 31. All children of the parish are invited to wear a saint costume and be prepared to tell a few facts so others can guess your saint.
- **NAMES OF DEPARTED SOULS** to be remembered in prayers and Masses during November: You may write names on the clipboards, or bring your own typed or written papers. The lists will be placed on the altar during November, the month of the Poor Souls.
- **DOORS WILL BE OPEN** for "toties quoties" visits for the Poor Souls on November 1 from noon to 8 PM, and on November 2 from 6:30 AM to 8 PM.
- **DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME** ends next Sunday, November 3.
- **2024 SPOKANE FATIMA CONFERENCE** talks are available for free viewing. The link has been added to our parish website sermon page.
- **LOOKING AHEAD TO THE FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION:** Because December 8 this year is a Sunday of Advent, the feast has been transferred to Monday, December 9. The transferred feast is not a Holy Day of Obligation, and the faithful are only required to attend Mass on Sunday, Dec. 8. However, the obligation to fast and abstain on December 7 (Saturday) is still in effect (as seen by the "F" and the fish on your Catholic calendars.)
- **SUNDAY CATECHISM** will not be held today, but please make sure that children who are preparing to receive first Holy Communion or Confirmation in the spring are studying their questions and prayers daily, and will be ready to be quizzed at classes. In order to be ready to receive these sacraments by spring:
- **CONFIRMATION** students must understand and memorize *at least* half of their study sheets before Christmas.
- **FIRST COMMUNICANTS** should be in 2nd grade, and must understand and memorize the catechism questions by December. They also should have learned the rest of the catechism book by January and be ready to be questioned around that time. All parents with children in 2nd grade should have received information from Sister for preparing your child for their First Holy Communion. If there are any parents that have a child in 2nd grade, but have not talked with Sister Anne Marie, please do so ASAP.
- **FIRST GRADERS** should also be regularly attending catechism classes in order to be ready to prepare for first Holy Communion the next year. If you have any questions, please contact the sisters.

Indulgences to be gained during the month of the Poor Souls-

A **plenary indulgence** for the Poor Souls may be gained from noon on Nov. 1st to midnight, Nov. 2nd, *as often as* ("toties quoties") one visits a church in suffrage for the Poor Souls, if one also goes to Confession and Communion and says at each visit six Our Fathers, six Hail Mary's and six Glory Be's for the intentions of the Church. (*Move your lips when praying to gain indulgences.*)

A **plenary indulgence**, applicable only to the dead, may also be gained by the faithful under the usual conditions during the period of eight days from the commemoration of All Souls' Day inclusive, and on each day of the Octave, when they visit a cemetery in a spirit of piety and devotion, and pray, even mentally, for the dead.
