Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last good confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.
(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You must also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

We are happy to see new faces at Immaculate Conception Church, and we look forward to seeing you again!

Confessions: 30 minutes before each scheduled Friday, Saturday, & Sunday Mass; before or during the 8:00 Wednesday Mass; and after Saturday Mass.

- **MIRACULOUS MEDAL ENROLLMENT** for anyone who has not yet been enrolled will be after all the Sunday Masses today, November 24. You do not need to bring your own medal to the communion rail after Mass, since Father will have one to use for the enrollment. You may obtain your own medal anytime. Blessed medals are available for a donation, on the shelf to the right inside the parish library.
- **FRIDAY AFTER THANKSGIVING:** Your Catholic calendars do not show a picture of a fish on the Friday after Thanksgiving due to a dispensation from the bishops of the USA before Vatican II. Meat is allowed in our country on the Friday after Thanksgiving.
- **SUNDAY CATECHISM** will not be held on Dec. 8, 22, and 29.
- **TARCISIANS** of the Sacred Heart will meet after the first Friday Communion on Dec. 6, feast of St. Nicholas. Please pack a breakfast as usual to eat before the meeting in Becket Hall.
- **ST. NICHOLAS** will visit the children on December 8 after the 7:00 and 9:00 Masses. Feel free to bring sweets or sandwiches for a finger food potluck for the visit of St. Nicholas, as well as to celebrate our parish feast day of the Immaculate Conception.
- **ADSUM** (Seminary newsletter) is available free of charge on the vestibule counter. You may also ask the seminary to put you on their mailing list, so that you will receive the newsletter at your home with an envelope for monthly donations. There is also a link to the seminary website on our parish website.
