#### Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last good confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You must also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

# <u>Confessions</u>: 30 minutes before each scheduled Friday, Saturday, & Sunday Mass; before or during the 8:00 Wednesday Mass; and after Saturday Mass.

- <u>TARCISIANS</u> of the Sacred Heart will meet after the first Friday Communion on Dec. 6, feast of St. Nicholas. Please pack a breakfast as usual to eat before the meeting in Becket Hall.
- FAST (age 21-59) AND COMPLETE ABSTINENCE (age 7 and older) is obligatory under pain of mortal sin on Saturday, December 7, the vigil of the Immaculate Conception.



- FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION: Because December 8 this year is a Sunday of Advent, the feast has been transferred to Monday, December 9. The transferred feast is not a Holy Day of Obligation, and the faithful are only required to attend Mass on Sunday, Dec. 8. However, the obligation to fast and abstain on December 7 (Saturday) is still in effect (as seen by the "F" and the fish on your Catholic calendars.)
- <u>ST. NICHOLAS</u> will visit the children on December 8 after the 7:00 and 9:00 Masses. Feel free to bring sweets or sandwiches for a finger food potluck for the visit of St. Nicholas, as well as to celebrate our parish feast day of the Immaculate Conception.
- <u>CMRI CATHOLIC CALENDARS</u> indicate all fast days for those aged 21 to 59 with the capital letter "F" and all abstinence days for those aged 7 and older with a
  - abstinence days for those aged 7 and older with a picture of a fish (or a half fish for days when meat is allowed only once.) When supplies here at church run out, you will need to order calendars directly from Mary Immaculate Queen Center. There is a link for their bookstore on our website's resources page.
- TOTAL CONSECRATION: If you have been making the preparation for Total Consecration, please let Father or one of the sisters know which Mass you will attend on December 8 so that your forms and candles will be ready.
