Welcome To Newcomers!

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind them that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

- A baptized Catholic, free from any mortal sin committed since one's last good confession,
- Fasting for three hours from any food and alcoholic drink and one hour from any other drink except water.

(Unless you have been attending the traditional Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with one of the priests.)

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in church. Before the changes in the Church, Catholic parishes had standards for modest and appropriate attire, which are important both for the edification of others and out of respect for the house of God. Please observe these standards of dress for church:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. If you do not have a hat or veil, you may borrow a veil from the vestibule. You must also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees when standing or sitting. Pants, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a dress shirt and dress pants. Jeans, shorts, and casual attire are not appropriate for attendance at Mass.

• <u>DAY OF COMPLETE FAST & ABSTINENCE</u>: The vigil of the Nativity, December 24, is a day of fast for those age 21-59 and a day of complete abstinence for those age 7 and older.



- SCHOOL BAKE SALE is after all three Masses on Dec. 22 in the parish hall for a free will donation for ICA.
- <u>DECEMBER 25 & JANUARY 1</u>, the feasts of the Nativity and of the Circumcision of Our Lord, are holydays of obligation. Mass attendance & avoidance of unnecessary servile work & shopping is obligatory, just as on a Sunday.
- <u>SKATING PARTY</u>: Parishioners of all ages are welcome to come roller blading/skating at Skatin' Place from 12:30 to 2:30 PM on Tuesday, January 7. All individuals and parents of families must pay for your own family at the counter when you arrive. No need to RSVP. Each person who skates will need to pay \$9.50, whether you bring your own roller blades or skates, or whether you borrow their roller skates. (If you want to borrow roller *blades*, you will need an additional \$2.00.) There will be a concession stand with food to buy as well.
- In the event of severe weather conditions, contact Sr. Philomena to see if the party is still on.
- EPIPHANY POTLUCK will be after all the Masses on Sunday, January 12.
- YOUNG ADULT PARTY: Parishioners who are in high school and up will have games and activities after the 11:00 Mass and potluck on Sunday, January 12. All young adults of the parish are welcome! Feel free to bring board games if you would like to stay and play longer after the group activities are finished. Also, bring snacks to share if you plan to stay a few hours.

Please check to see if you have accidentally picked up a missal that is not yours, and place it on the lost and found counter in the parish hall. Also, please put your name in all missals and prayer books.
