## \* EASTER DUTY \*

All the faithful who have reached the use of reason are gravely obliged to receive Holy Communion worthily at least once during the Easter season. In the United States, this extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).

- CATECHISM: April 6 will be the last day of Sunday catechism for this school year. .
- **TARCISIANS** will meet this Friday, after morning distribution of Holy Communion. .
- CMRI CONFRATERNITY will meet this Saturday after 8 AM Mass. •
- PARISH CLEANING DAY & WORK PARTY will be on Saturday, April 12 after the 8:00 Mass. •
- CONFIRMATION will be on May 25 after the 9:00 Mass. If you or your children are being confirmed, please fill out a form from the vestibule, and return to the slot in the counter before Easter. Thank you!
- **SPONSORS** must be of the same gender as the person being confirmed, and they must be *practicing traditional Catholics* who are already validly confirmed.
- **BAPTISMAL CERTIFICATES** must be provided if our . church does not already have your certificate from a previous sacrament received here. The original copies will be returned to you.
- **CONDITIONAL**: If any adult parishioners were • confirmed in the Vatican II church around 1973 or after, and you have not yet been conditionally confirmed in the traditional rite, you may be conditionally confirmed on May 25. Sign up ASAP, using the forms in the vestibule.

#### Catechism Review (From the Baltimore Catechism) - The Virtues

121. What are the three **theological virtues**? The three theological virtues are **faith**, **hope**, and **charity**.

122. What is **faith**? Faith is the virtue by which we firmly believe all the truths God has revealed, on the word of God revealing them, who can neither deceive nor be deceived.

123. What is hope? Hope is the virtue by which we firmly trust that God, who is all-powerful and faithful to His promises, will in His mercy give us eternal happiness and the means to obtain it.

124. What is charity? Charity is the virtue by which we love God above all things for His own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God.

132. Which are the chief moral virtues? The chief moral virtues are: prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance; these are called cardinal virtues.

134. How do prudence, justice, fortitude and temperance dispose us to lead good lives? Prudence disposes us in all circumstances to form right judgments about what we must do or not do. Justice disposes us to give everyone what belongs to him. Fortitude disposes us to do what is good in spite of any difficulty. Temperance disposes us to control our desires and to use rightly the things which please ourselves.

135. Which are some of the other moral virtues?

Some of the other moral virtues are:

Filial piety and patriotism, which dispose us to honor, love, and respect our parents and our country.

Obedience, which disposes us to do the will of our superiors.

Veracity, which disposes us to tell the truth.

Liberality, which disposes us rightly to use worldly goods.

Patience, which disposes us to bear up under trials and difficulties.

Humility, which disposes us to acknowledge our limitations.

Chastity, or purity, which disposes us to be pure in soul and body.

Besides these, there are many other moral virtues.
