Days of the week suggested for praying each set of Mysteries (*from the prayerbook for CMRI Religious*)-

JOYFUL- Mondays, Thursdays, the Sundays of Advent, the Sundays from Christmas until Septuagesima (Pre-Lent), and daily during the twelve days of Christmas.

SORROWFUL- Tuesdays, Fridays, the Sundays of Pre-Lent and Lent, and daily during Passiontide.

GLORIOUS- Wednesdays, Saturdays, Sundays from Easter until Advent, and daily during Easter week.

*** EASTER DUTY ***

All the faithful who have reached the use of reason are gravely obliged to receive Holy Communion worthily at least once during the Easter season. In the United States, this extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).



- **HOLY SATURDAY** is a day of complete abstinence from meat for all those aged 7 and older, and a full fast day until midnight for those aged 21-59.

The faithful should genuflect only once on one knee at the front of the church before kneeling to kiss the crucifix. Please genuflect while the person ahead of you is venerating the crucifix so that the line keeps moving. If anyone cannot kneel, the servers can lift the crucifix up for you.

Catechism Review (*From the Baltimore Catechism*) - The Laws of the Church (continued)

287. Who are obliged to observe the fast days of the Church?

All baptized persons between the ages of twenty-one and fifty-nine are obliged to observe the fast days of the Church, unless they are excused or dispensed.

288. What is a day of abstinence?

A day of abstinence is a day on which we are not allowed the use of meat.

289. Who are obliged to observe the abstinence days of the Church?

All Catholics who have passed their seventh birthday and have attained the use of reason are obliged to observe the abstinence days of the Church, unless excused or dispensed.

290. Why does the Church command us to fast and to abstain?

The Church commands us to fast and to abstain in order that we may control the desires of the flesh, raise our minds more freely to God, and make satisfaction for sin.

291. Why does the Church make Fridays a day of abstinence?

The Church makes Fridays a day of abstinence to remind us of Our Lord's death on Good Friday.
